Thank you from the Warden

In a year like no other, the life and rhythms of the College have been profoundly affected by the ongoing pandemic: as well as academic challenges, the loss of all conference activity and accommodation revenues has had a major impact on Merton's finances.

The difficulties gave way to a number of positives, however. I am delighted to report that philanthropic giving was the strongest since the end of the 750th Anniversary Campaign, with alumni and well-wishers giving support to a whole array of College projects and needs, as detailed on pages 8 and 9. I was especially thrilled that the 2021 leavers took it upon themselves to contribute to a collective gift (which was match funded) dedicated to student support in the areas of welfare and mental health.

We have learned much about ourselves during this pandemic. As we emerge from what we hope has been the worst of it, we now feel energised to make plans and hope we can take all our alumni on a journey with us.

Elsewhere, the *Merton Women: 40 Years* celebrations, entirely online, saw contributions from a galaxy of alumnae which in turn brought engagement from across the world. The move to online activities brought together alumni in a way that in-person events would not have done, chiefly by giving many Mertonians instant access to talks, lectures, interviews and other opportunities. The engagement of so many alumni encouraged the

College community in Oxford throughout the lockdown.

We have learned much about ourselves during this pandemic. As we emerge from what we hope has been the worst of it, we now feel energised to make plans and hope we can take all our alumni on a journey with us.

I hope you will be encouraged by what you read in the coming pages. Thank you for being part of Merton's incredible community and helping preserve the College's future.

The College finances



expenditures for the year were just under £17 million. This figure includes a transfer of funds to the University in support of the Regius Professorship, as well as costs incurred to continue several projects to develop land on the College's estates. Merton's endowment benefited from the recovery in the global markets since the lows seen immediately after the outset of the pandemic. Our holdings in the equity markets, both public and private, showed significant returns over the year and the College realised proceeds from the sale of land for development. Although some of its commercial property holdings continued to be affected by the pandemic, there were no further significant declines in values compared with 2019-20. Overall, the College's endowment saw net gains of about £44 million during the year, bringing the total value of our endowed funds to about £314 million. This figure includes donations and legacies generously provided by our alumni and friends over many years.

Now in its third year, the pandemic continues to affect the College's finances, which nevertheless have shown tremendous resilience. Merton has been able to continue to support its students and staff throughout this uncertain period while building its financial stability and strength for the future.

2020-21 was another year in which the College finances were impacted by the effects of the pandemic. As the year started, the College adjusted teaching and residential arrangements for students who were allowed to return after the complete shutdown in Trinity term of 2020. The College set up the necessary policies and protocols to keep students and staff safe and provide the best experience possible for students under the circumstances.

The lockdowns in November 2020 and January 2021 required significant adjustments to which students and staff adapted well given the difficulties, particularly the need to react promptly to changes in government regulations. The College continued to see a significant impact both on its revenues, as conference and accommodation income was lost, and on its costs, as the College had to invest in extra facilities. Examples of these extra facilities are the marquee on Chestnut Lawn, to facilitate socially distanced dining, and the necessary personal protective equipment to keep the College community as safe as possible. The eventual easing of all restrictions came too late for any financial benefit in the year, and the College continued to furlough some staff, but fewer than in 2019-20.

Total income for the year was just over £13.8 million. There was virtually no income from conferences because of the pandemic. Student accommodation income was in line with the previous year but reduced from levels seen before the pandemic struck. Investment income from the endowment recovered from the reduced levels of 2019-20 as equity dividends and rents from the College's properties improved. The College received about half the level of income from the UK Government's Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme that it had received the previous year. Total



Merton College Benefactions Committee: 2021 Report to Donors

The Committee, which was formed in July 2012, presents its report to the College's benefactors for the financial year to 31 July 2021. The Committee comprises **Tim Morrison (1972)**, Chair, **William Watson (1980)** and **Caroline Doan (1997)**. Meetings are attended by the Finance Bursar and the Development Director.

In the past year, we have received information from the Warden about the College's strategic direction and the consequential current spending priorities. This has included a discussion of the impact of the pandemic. We have obtained certain information relating to the College's control of, and accounting for, the receipt, investment and disbursement of benefactions (both restricted and unrestricted) and have discussed these matters with the Finance Bursar, the Development Director, the College Accountant and the external auditors. Because Merton College Charitable Corporation ('MC3'), which is incorporated in the USA, is a charity independent of the College, we have performed no work in respect of benefactions received by MC3 until they have been transferred by MC3 to the College.

We have also reviewed, on a sample basis, a number of material benefactions received by the College (both restricted and unrestricted) to satisfy ourselves that, in each case selected, the relevant funds have been properly recorded to enable disbursements to be made in accordance with the donor's wishes.

On the basis of the work we have performed, we confirm that nothing has come to our attention which casts doubt on the way in which the receipt, investment and disbursement of benefactions have been controlled and accounted for by the College during the year ended 31 July 2021.

Olivia Tan (2018)

Before leaving Merton last June, I had the chance to donate £12.64 towards student support and welfare, as part of the 2021 leavers' cohort. Our time at Merton was certainly unprecedented and far from straightforward, but we all benefited from access to immediate help, whenever it was needed and no matter the problem. I think I can speak for all my peers in saying that we were offered a huge range of support from the College. From scones and one-on-one chats with the Welfare Deans to walks with Geoffrey Biscuit, the Warden's Golden Retriever, and tailored support for those in need, help was always free from judgement, accompanied by patience, kindness and a cup of tea.

The Leavers' Gift was a brilliant way to say thank you to the College Chaplain, the Revd Canon Dr Simon Jones, Jenny Barrett, the Welfare Advisor, and the whole Welfare Team, and we are especially grateful to Mustafa Abbas for matching it. Our individual contributions of £12.64 will combine to support all the valuable welfare work done at the College.

Your Gifts at Work

During the last financial year (1 August 2020 to 31 July 2021), the College secured £3,732,043 (gross) in new funds (2019-20: £1,182,463) with a total of £3,050,136 received in cash (2019-20: £1,166,485). Additionally, the College drew down over £1 million in match funding from the University for the Regius Chair in Mathematics. Despite the severe limitations of the pandemic, when opportunities to meet with alumni and supporters were hugely curtailed, the level of contributions towards the College was significant.

As reported in more detail on pages 10-11, the College received exceptionally generous support from a group of key Mertonian donors to endow the Regius Professorship in Mathematics; we held a successful

virtual telethon; received funding to replace the weathered Bastion Benches; the campaign to endow the Michael Baker Tutorship in Physics made very good progress (and was completed by the end of 2021); and the Leavers' Gift outlined on page 7 was a great success. In addition, significant gifts were made to the Library, the College Choir, the Leventis Research Fellowship in Ancient Greek, and the MC3 John Kirby Graduate Scholarship. The major donors to the latter were, respectively, **John Booth (1976, Wylriot Fellow)**, **Reed Rubin (1957, Bodley Fellow)**, the **Leventis Foundation**, and posthumously, **John Kirby (1962, former MC3 President)**. Other significant donations from Mertonians and friends are reported on pages 11 and 12.

Figure 1: New funds raised and cash received over the last five financial years

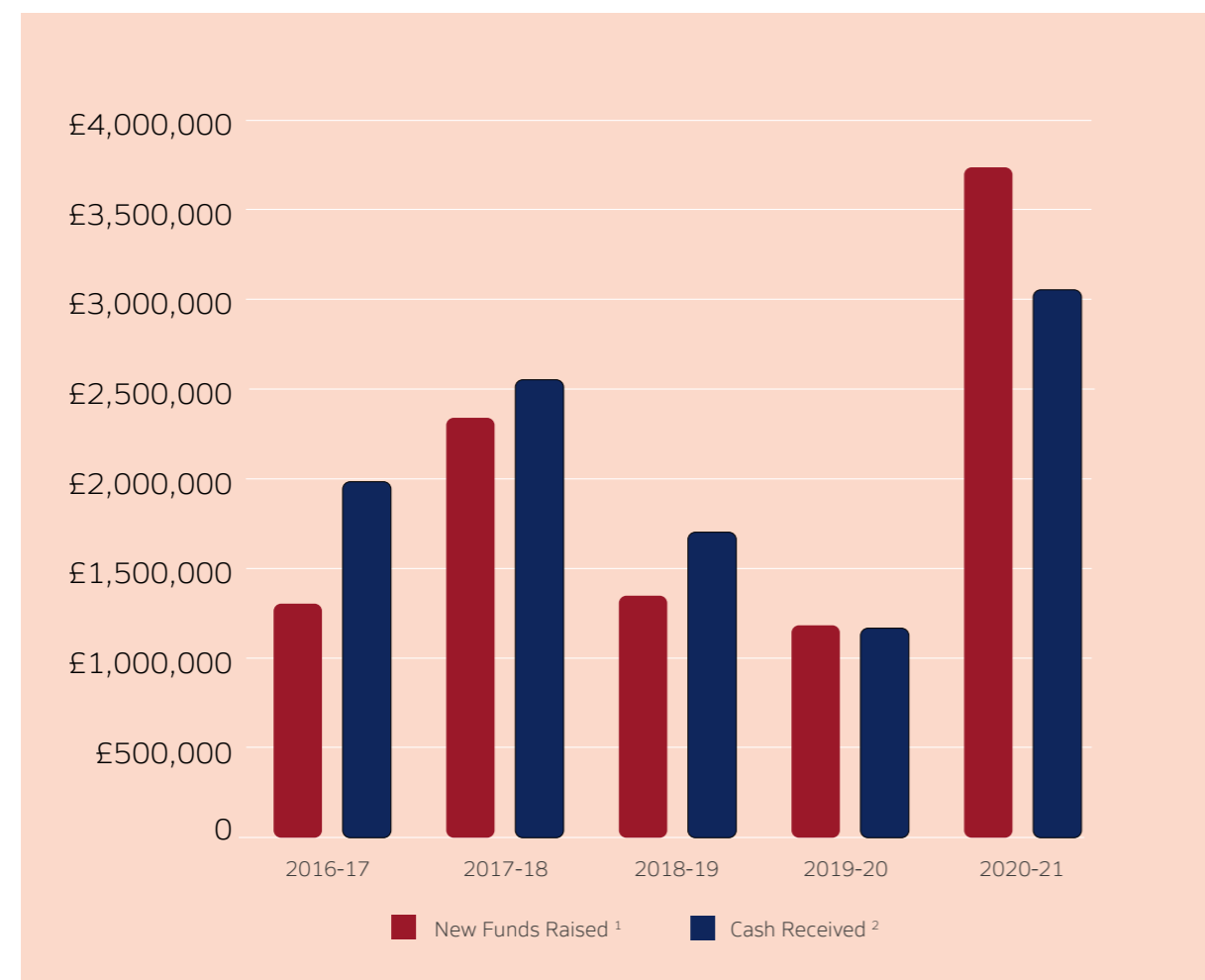

Figure 2: New funds raised by fundraising priority¹

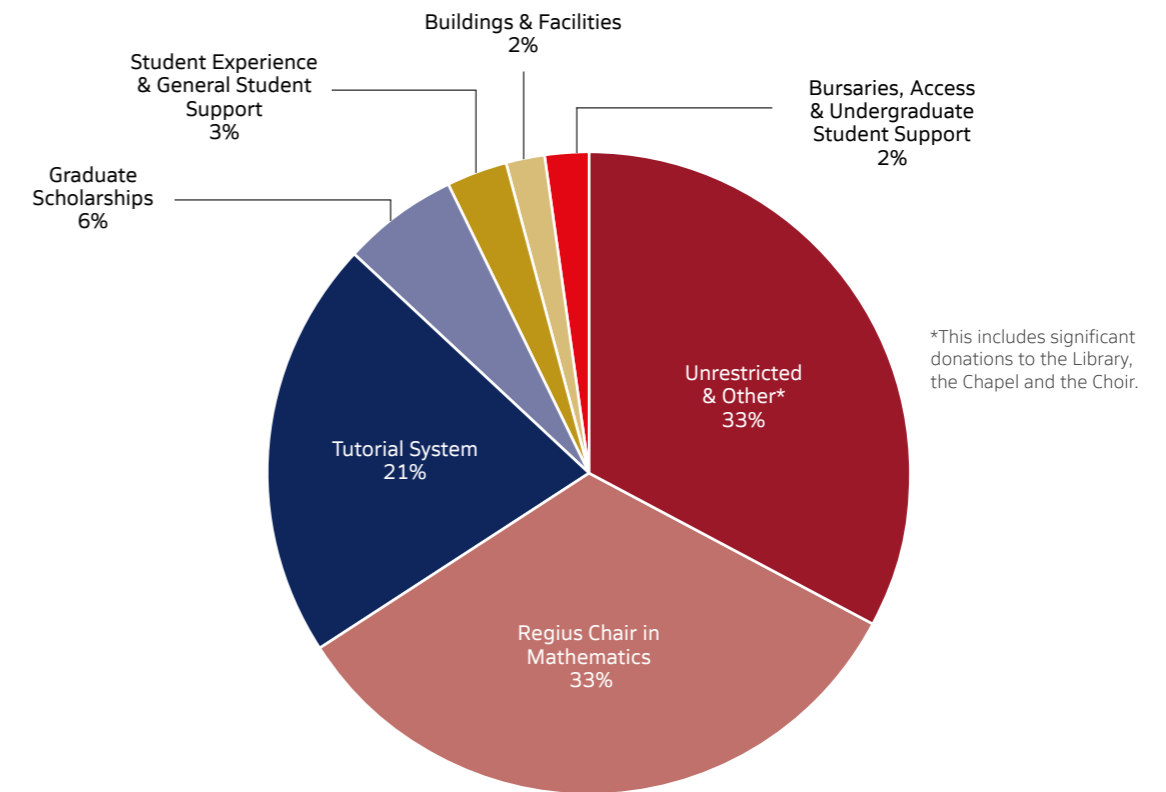
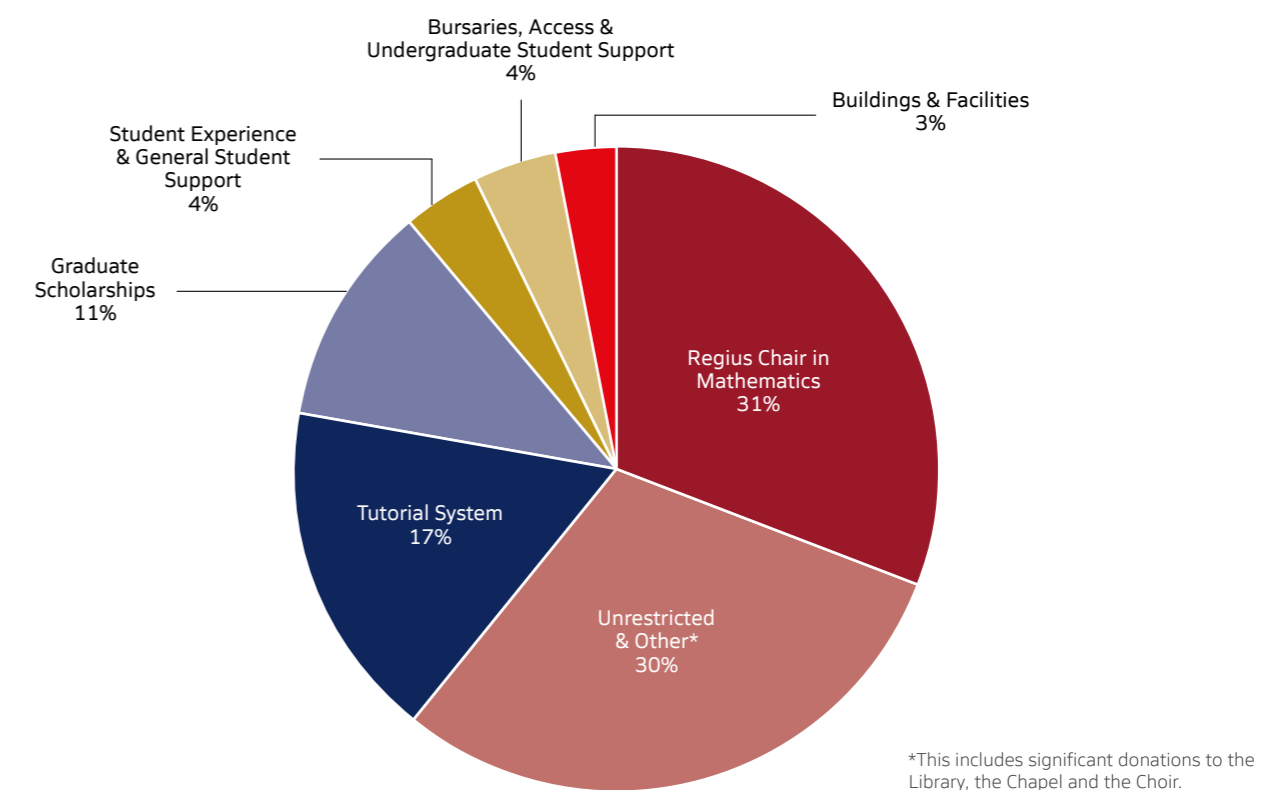
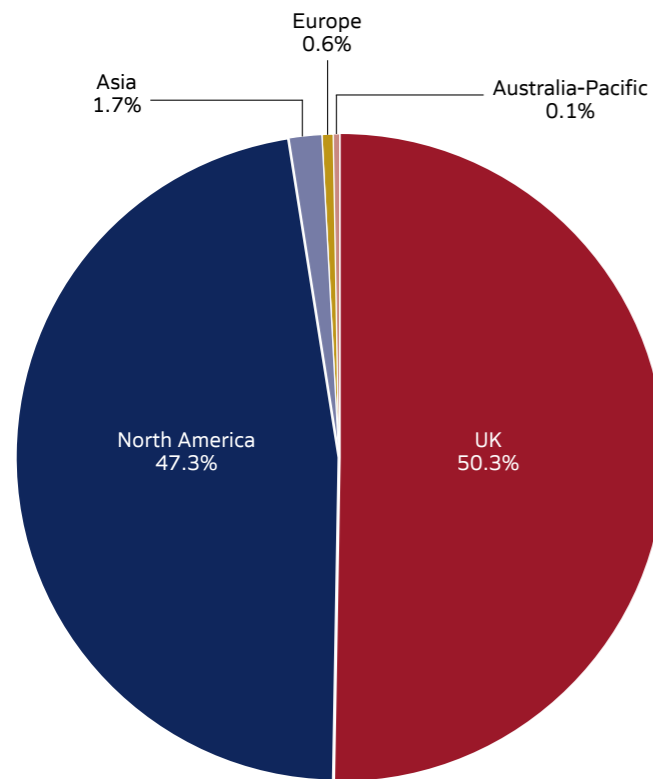


Figure 3: Cash received by fundraising priority²

Mertonians fund prestigious Regius Chair in Mathematics

On 5 August 2020, we were delighted to announce that the Regius Professorship in Mathematics at Oxford will become a permanent fixture at Merton. We are immensely proud of our enduring connection with this rare and sovereign-granted post, which was announced as part of the Queen's 90th birthday celebrations. Merton's **Professor Sir Andrew Wiles (1971, Fellow)**, a renowned mathematician famous for his proof of Fermat's Last Theorem, was appointed as the first holder of the Chair in May 2018, and we are grateful that it will stay at Merton permanently after he retires.

The philanthropy of Mertonians has been critical in endowing this prestigious post and ensuring its financial sustainability for the future. For their exceptional support and generosity, we would like to thank **John Booth (1976, Wyliot Fellow)**, **Peter Braam (Wyliot Fellow)**, **Charles Manby (1976, Wyliot Fellow)**, the **MC3 Board of Trustees**, **Andrew Robertson (1988)** and **Howard Stringer (1961, Honorary Fellow)**. Together, Merton alumni raised more than £2.25 million for the endowment and, with their generosity, also helped attract over £1 million in University match funding for the post.

The Warden, Professor Irene Tracey (1985), commented: *'I am enormously grateful to our alumni for stepping up at a critical moment to fund the Regius Professorship in Mathematics. I am thrilled that this post now has a permanent home at our College, which has been at the heart of Oxford Mathematics since the Merton Calculators emerged in the 14th century. Our lasting association with this Regius Chair is something that all Mertonians should feel very proud of and celebrate.'*

Student callers raise £234,000 in 'lockdown Telethon'

From 6 to 20 April 2021, 14 student callers took part in a Merton Telethon like no other before. Due to pandemic restrictions, the campaign took place virtually, with students calling alumni safely from their rooms. Given the isolating experience of lockdown, the students were especially eager to talk to alumni, share experiences of Merton, and raise funds for the College.

The 'lockdown Telethon' was a great success. The callers connected with around 400 alumni and raised £222,000 over two weeks, with more than half of those contacted choosing to give. The amount raised increased to £234,000 by the time the campaign closed, with many donations arriving online and by post.



We are very grateful to all the alumni who made donations during the Telethon. You have made an impact on College life in a number of ways: by providing financial support to students in need, helping to fund the exceptional (but expensive) tutorial system, and ensuring we can continue to offer the best possible living and working environment for students. The support of alumni was all the more important given the challenges of the pandemic, the impact of which continues to be felt.

Donations of all sizes remain vital, and we are pleased to report that a mini-Telethon in December 2021 has built on previous successes. A small team of six student callers, mainly working late at night to contact alumni overseas, raised more than £40,000 for the College in one week. We were heartened by, and very thankful for, this wonderful generosity.

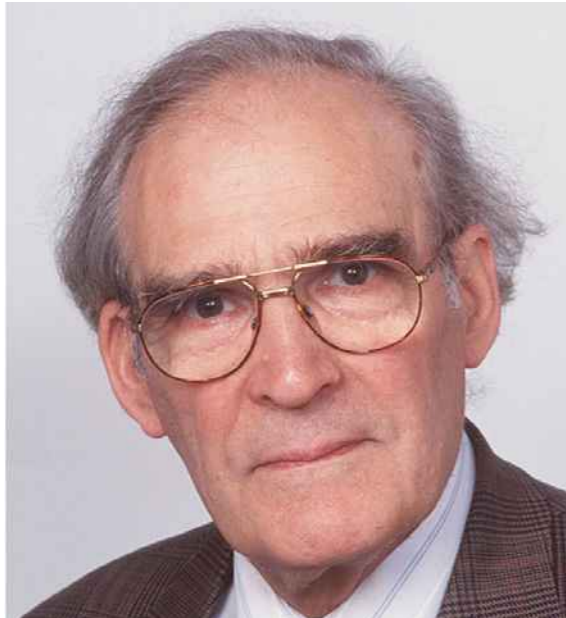


Bastion Bench Appeal

In June 2021 we reported that the elements had finally done for the six-person elliptical bench on the Bastion, a focal point of the Fellows' Garden and a favourite spot for Mertonians across the ages, JRR Tolkien being remembered as one (the stone table it sits with is known affectionately as 'Tolkien's table').

We appealed in the *Merton Messenger* e-newsletter for six benefactors to pledge support for the replacement of the benches, a call that elicited a flurry of interest, reminiscence and sponsorship. Within hours of the appeal, the job was done. The College has now been able to commission the construction of new bespoke Bastion benches funded by nine Mertonians. We are delighted to have been oversubscribed in our appeal and we look forward to our supporters 'taking their seat' once the newly constructed furniture is put in place around Easter 2022.

A key renovation for the Lower Library

The College is grateful to **John Mitnick (1985)**, whose generosity in memory of his father, Howard Mitnick, enabled the renewal and renovation of a reading room in the Lower Library in Mob Quadrangle.



Although this project was completed during the 2020-21 financial year, lockdowns and pandemic restrictions have meant that the reading room has only been in full use since Michaelmas term 2021. Nevertheless, it has already made a great impact and proved popular with students.

The key element of the renovation was the installation of a soundproof glass door between the room and the rest of the Library. This makes it possible for group study and teaching to take place without disturbing readers elsewhere. John's support also funded the purchase of high-quality movable furniture, including a height-adjustable table, as well as major improvements to the lighting and its energy efficiency. The room is now particularly well suited to object-based teaching that employs ancient artefacts, such as manuscripts, from the College's renowned collection.

Baker Tutorship in Physics makes progress... and reaches £1 million target

During the 2020-21 financial year, major progress was made on the College's appeal to endow a Tutorship in Physics in memory of Michael Baker. At the outset, on 1 August 2020, £299,000 had been raised in gifts and pledges towards the target of £1 million. This total increased significantly over the next 12 months, and by 31 July 2021 the appeal stood at £810,000. We are grateful to everyone who supported this campaign, which will fund one of our Tutorships in Physics in perpetuity, thereby securing its permanence and protecting the tutorial system for the future.

Special thanks are due to MC3 Life Trustee **Reg Hall (1954)** and **Stephen Quake (1991)**, whose very generous matching gifts made an important contribution and inspired many others to donate. Reg and Stephen's steadfast leadership and commitment to the future of Merton Physics made a critical difference throughout the year. We would also like to extend particular thanks to **Simon Orebi Gann (1968)** and his daughter **Gabriel Orebi Gann (2004)** for their munificent donation.

We are pleased to report that, by the end of 2021, the target of £1 million in gifts and pledges was not only reached but was slightly surpassed, with a number of alumni further bolstering and future-proofing the endowment fund against rising costs.

Professor Simon Hooker, Tutor in Physics, said: *'The entire Merton Physics team is incredibly grateful for the support of Merton alumni and friends, who have done so much to preserve and safeguard the excellence of our subject for future generations of students. Michael Baker was our very first tutor in Physics and, given his dedication and commitment to the tutorial system, I can think of no better way of honouring his memory.'*



This renovation project has come at an auspicious moment, as the College prepares to undertake work of historic proportions to conserve its academic heritage and enhance its library provision. An appeal is currently ongoing to preserve in perpetuity the Upper Library's medieval stained-glass windows, which are under threat from condensation.
