In a volatile and uncertain world, we continue our mission to deliver excellence and opportunity and to ensure we are open to talented people from all backgrounds. I hope you feel you can help us in this dimension. All gifts will be gratefully received.

Graduate Scholarships

Increasing support for graduate students is a major priority for the College. Thanks to the impressive collective generosity of Mertonians and friends, a number of new graduate scholarships have been funded in the last three years alone. Subjects include: Chemistry, Archaeology, Law, History, and research on sustainability in a variety of disciplines. We have also established scholarships for Ukrainian refugee students.

With increased financial pressures on students, we strive to maintain this momentum. The College wants to provide as much support as possible, especially for students in Humanities subjects facing chronic underfunding.

New Graduate Scholarship in Music (Target: £80,000)

This year we aim to raise £80,000 to provide essential living costs for four years of doctoral study in Music, a financially-challenged subject which evokes our shared humanity and cultural appreciation. We will look to match the living costs grant with University funding for fees, creating one full scholarship and a transformational opportunity for a talented student. A chance to name the scholarship will be offered for a donation of the full target. In that event, any surplus will support the establishment of a second scholarship.

Refugee Academic Futures Scholarship (Target: £215,000)

This scholarship will provide a significant opportunity by fully funding a graduate student - from any part of the world - who is a refugee or has experienced forced displacement. Building on our recent funding for Syrian and Ukrainian scholars, we are eager to ensure that our academic community can support students who have been displaced due to conflict, persecution or deprivation of their human rights. This scholarship is open to all subjects and is part of a wider University of Oxford programme, through which the recipient can receive mentoring and tailored support - before, during, and after their studies.

Black Academic Futures Scholarship (Target: £112,500)


As we approach the third year of the Black Academic Futures Graduate Scholarship, we would like to express our gratitude to the alumni and friends who have made this opportunity possible. Thanks to your support, only 8% of the target remains to be raised.

This scholarship provides full funding for three years of postgraduate study for students of Black or Mixed Black ethnicity resident in the UK. It was started with the aim of addressing the under-representation of Black British graduate students at Oxford compared to the UK university sector. With your support we can complete this scholarship and ensure our academic community continues to benefit from diverse perspectives.

Helping our sporting students (Target: £20,000)

Committed to supporting sports participation and achievement, the College is keen for students to develop their athletic talents, benefiting both physical and mental health.
