From the Warden

It has been wonderful to see the extensive and generous engagement of our alumni family again this year.

This Annual Report is testament to that engagement, as we acknowledge and celebrate the enormous contribution made by Mertonians and friends.

Donations in support of so many College activities make a real difference to our collective ability to support our academic endeavours, amongst so many other things. In the following pages you can see the importance the College places on graduate scholarships and what a transformational difference support in this area is making. In particular, a newly endowed graduate scholarship in Physics, generously funded by Jim Buckee (1968) and his wife Susan, will provide an opportunity in perpetuity for a first-rate graduate student.

We are also delighted to launch the Weston Earth Scholarships programme, which has a strong focus on sustainability and is funded by The Hilary and Galen Weston Foundation. Our first two Weston Earth Scholars started their graduate studies at Merton in Michaelmas term 2024 and we pay tribute to **Alannah Weston (1991)** for her guidance and support in realising this special partnership.

Our alumni's engagement is not restricted to financial contributions. We are fortunate to have a myriad of volunteers who add so much to our dynamic community. Merton Society Council President Dame Philippa Whipple (1984), and her husband Sam Whipple (1983), have been instrumental in helping us launch the Merton College Mentoring programme, and we are indebted to those who have signed up as mentors. Other alumni have helped lead a series of subject-specific interest groups ranging from the Biomedical and Life Sciences to Net Zero. Additionally, the Merton Lawyers' Association, through the leadership of Dan Schaffer (1986) and his committee, has delivered high-profile events and support for our students in Law. Moreover, our diaspora in North America, MC3 (the Merton College Charitable Corporation), provides truly exceptional support with fundraising and alumni events, led by MC3 President Nick Allard (1974).

This has been an exceptional year, with such generosity and goodwill in evidence, and I am immensely proud to serve the Merton community as its Warden.

I look forward to meeting many of you in the coming 12 months, either back at College or further afield.

The College finances

Total income for the year was £21.1 million, over £4.5m higher than the preceding year. Income from donations saw a significant increase (of over £3 million). Income from charitable activities (teaching, research and residential) and investment income also rose. The College saw income growth from its conference activities as well, with total income from conferences surpassing the figure achieved pre–Covid. Total expenditures for the year were a little over £21.8 million. Costs were up as the College spent more on maintenance of its historic buildings (part of a long–term repair plan), as pay costs rose and as the College continued to invest in its IT infrastructure. Utilities costs fell over the year, a sharp reversal from the increases seen in recent years.

Our public equities showed a strong performance for the year as markets showed considerable strength over the period. Private equities held their value over the year as revaluations continued to reflect equity price performance from prior periods; the longer-term returns remain positive and above public market equivalents. The College's property holdings saw excellent returns as developments on the College's estates achieved key milestones, particularly land just outside Oxford where the College was granted planning permission for 540 homes after a successful appeal. Overall, the College's endowment saw net gains of £46 million, bringing the total value of our endowed funds to just over £375 million.

The College continued to consider its governance and risk management processes. We undertook a substantial update of the risk register during the year and we set up an Audit Committee which met for the first time to consider the audit of the 2024 results and other related matters.

Development News

This Annual Report reflects on the financial year just gone, from 31 July 2023 to 1 August 2024. It presents the College's finances and pays tribute to the many benefactors who collectively make a material difference to the College's fortunes. We are proud to list the names of our donors, both those who have made generous contributions over the last year and those who have contributed over a lifetime of giving. Contributions in support of the central tenets of College life transform the experience of those in our academic community. It is this dedication to world-class scholarships that sets us apart: thank you to everyone who has helped propel this important mission.

This has been another hugely encouraging year for College fundraising, with new gifts and pledges totalling £3.85m. Showing how these gifts translate into sustaining key activities within the Merton community is the purpose of this publication, alongside recognition of those who have helped us get there.

We also pay tribute to a significant body of volunteers who gave their time and expertise. The Merton Society, led by Dame Phillipa Whipple (1984), inspires a global network of Mertonians and the varied activities of the Society bring us together for a whole host of opportunities. Our alumni events continue to attract significant numbers and in the last year our UK events have included Oxford, London, Cambridge and Exeter. We have also enjoyed reunions as far away as New York, Hong Kong, Singapore and, most recently, Munich, with the Merton Choir.

I wanted to provide an update for alumni on the progress of the new library development which we have discussed during the last financial year. Progress on this project has slowed due to the discovery of a medieval ditch in the adjacency of the old city (medieval) walls in Rose Lane gardens, our preferred site for construction. College was subsequently advised by Oxford City Council and English Heritage that planning permission for a building on that site was highly unlikely to receive consent and so the Strategic Space Review Group continues to undertake a search for an alternative site within College. We will report progress to our alumni as this develops.

We encourage all Mertonians and friends to maintain their close affiliation with the College. A warm welcome awaits your return: we hope to see you again soon.

Your gifts at work

In the financial year 1 August 2023 to 31 July 2024 the College secured £3,356,830 (gross) in new gifts and pledges (2022-23: £8,124,260), whilst an additional £494,000 was credited by the University's Graduate Endowment Matched Funding Scheme (GEMS), making a grand total of £3,850,830. A sum of £4,945,000 was received in cash (2022-23: £2,171,497).

These results maintain the fundraising momentum of more recent years, as the figure below illustrates, demonstrating the resilience of alumni and friend support for the College's core purposes and mission.

A significant number of appeals were successfully completed within the year. In particular, the Upper Library's medieval stained-glass windows appeal reached its target. As mentioned by the Warden, we are most grateful to Jim Buckee (1968), and his wife Susan, for the newly endowed Buckee Scholarship in Physics and were delighted to launch of The Hilary and Galen Weston Foundation Earth Scholarships. Funding was secured for a new Reach Scholarship for an undergraduate from a low-income

country thanks to significant support from Reg Hall (1954). We completed an appeal for the Sandy Irvine Centenary Exhibition and, with major support from Reed Rubin (1957), a tenth anniversary appeal of the Chapel's Dobson Organ which included a special organ recital by the world renowned organist Olivier Latry. We also completed funding for a full DPhil scholarship for a Ukrainian refugee student and a new DPhil scholarship in Law.


Our students always enjoy the opportunity to speak to alumni during the course of our annual Telethon campaign. This is an intense two-week enterprise for our student callers, but wonderful conversations ensue. This year, new gifts and pledges amounted to an astonishing £200,000. We had significant support from both our MCR newcomers and JCR leavers who contributed – by the magnitude of 97% uptake – towards a Posterity Gift and Leavers' Gift respectively. We remain grateful to Sven Kirkerup (2014) for once again matching the MCR gift and to Mustafa Abbas (1990) for matching the undergraduate Leavers' Gift for the fourth year running.


New funds raised and cash received over the last five financial years






New funds raised by fundraising priority

Preserving the library medieval stained glass

For the last four years, work has been underway to preserve for posterity the unique Upper Library windows, and we have run an appeal to fund, entirely from donations, this sensitive and transformative work.


As we reminded Mertonians at the time of the appeal launch, the windows of the Upper Library in Mob Quad include the oldest surviving examples of glazing for any English library. They stand as a stunning and arresting testament to the history and tradition of Merton.

The College has benefitted from the expertise of York Glaziers Trust, the oldest and largest specialist stained glass conservation studio in Britain, and one of the largest in Europe. The York Glaziers Trust is a charitable trust dedicated to the care and conservation of historic stained glass in York Minster and throughout the UK, and their work has been remarkable.

Remarkable, also, has been the level of support received from Mertonians who have chosen to support this once-only project with such generous donations. Here we pay tribute to those who opted to sponsor entire windows and to whom we owe particular appreciation.

To everyone who contributed something towards this defining preservation enterprise, thank you.

The cleaned and conserved windows, with protective glazing on the exterior, will be reinstalled by early summer 2025. We look forward to welcoming Mertonians to the Upper Library to view the results of the project.

Celebrating 10 years of the Dobson Organ



On Saturday, 20 April 2024 Olivier Latry visited Merton to play an Organ Concert to celebrate the 10th anniversary of the Dedication of the renowned Dobson Organ. Latry, who is the Organist of Notre-Dame Cathedral, Paris, played a programme of music by French composers, including Saint-Saens, Guilmant, Vierne, Gigout and Guillou and ended the concert with an extended improvisation on themes submitted by Merton's Organ Scholars. A capacity audience enjoyed the programme which demonstrated Latry's dazzling virtuosity as well as the variety of colours which are available on the Dobson Organ. We acknowledge the generous support of the Morris-Venables Charitable Foundation in making the concert, and the post-concert reception, possible.

A special service of Choral Evensong was sung by the College Choir prior to the Organ Concert, and included the world premiere of *Christiani Plaudite* by Matthew Martin. Martin's writing featured the organ is a striking way, and the piece has since been recorded by the College Choir on a forthcoming album of Merton commissions.

We are enormously grateful to the many donors who have supported the training of our organ scholars, the concert series, and the regular maintenance and upkeep of the organ. It was particularly good that **Reed Rubin (1957)** was able to be at Merton for this celebration, and that we were able to thank him for his exceptional support of the Chapel's music programme.

Merton is a leading player in Oxford by being able to offer a number of valuable graduate scholarships, and the College is committed to increasing these opportunities as a matter of academic priority. Thanks to the impressive generosity of Mertonians, new graduate scholarships have been funded in a range of disciplines in the last three years: Chemistry, Archaeology, Law, Mathematics, History and Physics. As well as annually-funded (or 'pay as you go') scholarships, we have also benefitted from receiving funds to endow a number of graduate scholarships.

As we go to press, we are delighted to have received notification from the Merton College Charitable Corporation (MC3), based in the United States, of their fourth endowed graduate scholarship, the Robert McKelvey Graduate Scholarship in support of the Humanities. This permanent scholarship joins the portfolio of existing MC3 graduate scholarships: the Americas, John Roberts and John Kirby Jr scholarships, and we remain indebted to our MC3 supporters for this extraordinary achievement.

With increased financial pressures on students, we strive to maintain this momentum and the College is committed to providing as much support as possible in order to recruit and retain some of the best scholars at Merton. This year we will be focusing on funding for the completion of graduate scholarships in Music and in Law and a Refugee Academic Futures Scholarship.

The impact of these scholarships is no better demonstrated than by the students themselves, and so we are delighted to include below reports from four of our current graduate scholars. Their passion for their studies, and their achievements and ambitions pay testament to the benefits of the graduate scholarships.



James Hua

MC3 John Kirby Graduate Scholar 2022-2025

I am now in my third year of a DPhil in Ancient Greek History, and my research focuses on population displacements and refugee crises in the Classical and early Hellenistic Greek world (550-300 BC). The MC3 John Kirby scholarship funds my course fees and living costs, enabling me to dedicate my time to research and study, to attend conferences and produce publications, and to teach in College and in the Faculty of Classics.

The funding has been invaluable in funding my archaeological excavation research and work in Greece. I have worked on excavations in Crete (Lyttos), Turkey (Aphrodisias), and Samos, for which the scholarship covered accommodation and transportation. The excavations have been a wonderfully educative experience, and I have uncovered new material directly related to my thesis research. I have now

co-authored papers on the new (ancient) inscriptions from both sites.

During my studies, I have given papers at conferences such as the Annual Conference of the Classical Association, the Institute of Classical Studies in London, and the Society of Classical Studies and Archaeological Institute of America annual conferences in Chicago and New Orleans, USA. This has

been immeasurably helpful in enabling me to share my research with other scholars, receive useful feedback, and form essential research connections and networks. On the back of these conferences, I published my first two single-authored papers and was invited to co-organise a conference in London, both of which will be invaluable for my future career.

All of this was only possible with the scholarship, which has enabled me to dedicate myself to academic work and service and motivated me to contribute all I can to the College and the Faculty of Classics. I try to give back in as many ways as possible, serving Merton and Oxford to help others to experience the wonderful, stimulating environment here. I am eternally grateful and look forward to continuing this dedication and research in my final year.

The culmination of the research and related publications facilitated by the funding was the Merton Graduate Prize Scholarship in June 2024. I was delighted to receive this award, and I aspire to continue extending my full academic potential with it.

The scholarship has also facilitated my involvement in College life. I have played for Merton's Tennis Team; been MCR President twice (2022-24) and I am a Graduate Mentor at Merton. I also teach some of the Classics undergraduates' Ancient Greek and Ancient History classes. I have attended extracurricular lecture series in the faculty as preparation for helping tutor them; delivered a lecture to undergraduates in my faculty and was awarded a qualification from the UK Higher Education Academy for my teaching.

Palmer Graduate Scholar 2022-2025

I come from Lausanne, Switzerland. After completing my undergraduate and graduate degrees in Physics, I wanted to pursue research in theoretical physics, specifically string theory. I was thrilled to be offered a fully funded place for a DPhil at Merton College, as this enabled me to pursue my studies without concern about the funding.

My research area can be summarised as a geometrical perspective on supergravity. Since starting my DPhil in October 2022, I have published six papers on various aspects of 'Localisation in Supergravity'.

The research they spring from was initiated by my supervisor and his collaborators, and their method allows one to compute various observables in supergravity (such as black hole entropy and CFT free energies) without explicitly solving the equation of motions. I have been applying this powerful technique to various setups, both recovering results from the literature in a straightforward and uniform way, and also producing new results.

I undertook these projects with a wonderful set of colleagues, some in Oxford and others further afield, with whom I feel very lucky and happy to be working.

My DPhil has also provided me with many learning and teaching opportunities. Since my first year, I have attended various weekly seminars in Oxford and I have given talks in the department of Mathematics. The latter have been excellent opportunities for me to practise communication skills and learn new topics. I have also tutored some Masters in Mathematical Physics courses.

The scholarship has enabled me to meet other academics from further afield. For instance, in my first year, I attended a weeklong school and workshop in Sao Paulo, and since then I have participated in conferences in Italy and the UK, meeting many prominent researchers in my field.

Coming to Merton was like coming to a ready-made community: I was able to meet people and settle in from day one. Especially in my first year, I enjoyed having lunch and dinner in College, attending MCR social events and yoga classes at College, and using the music rooms to practise my flute. There is an active social life via the MCR, and I have made some good friends in College.

MC3 Americas Graduate Scholar 2023-2026

I've just completed my first year of my DPhil in Theoretical Physics at Merton and it has been an amazing experience. Having completed my Natural Sciences degree at Cambridge, the MC3 Americas scholarship has given me the opportunity to do exciting research with world-leading academics, co-publish my first paper in an academic journal, and experience for the first time giving tutorials at Merton. It's also enabled me to take valuable breaks from physics, with time for sport and for pursuing a foreign language.

My research this year has focussed on novel physics that can arise in the new era of 'noisy intermediate-scale quantum devices'. These are platforms which allow fine control over the quantum properties of matter, providing an important stepping stone towards the goal of quantum computers. In particular, the quantum nature of measurements can play a large role in the evolution of the quantum state, rather than just being a diagnostic tool. I have been studying how these measurements impact states with randomness, and the types of states that these measurements can produce. Furthermore, the connectivity of



I am hugely grateful for the funding that has allowed me to work with, learn from, and make connections with top researchers in my field whilst leading a balanced life at Merton." such devices is not limited to conventional, Euclidean geometries; in fact, implementing non-Euclidean geometries might be crucial for error correction in quantum computers. Accordingly, I have been studying quantum dynamics on non-Euclidean lattices, and have recently uncovered a class of models which allow for many properties to be calculated exactly.

Alongside my main research project, I finished work on a project that I started during my Masters degree, on detecting topological features in ultra-cold atomic systems. This led to my co-publishing a paper in Physical Review Letters, which was selected as the Editor's Suggestion.

I have also undertaken lots of teaching, including the fourth year Advanced Quantum Theory course, and I have been a teaching assistant for the second year Thermal and Statistical Physics course, for which I took on tutorials during Trinity term. This Michaelmas, I have taught the condensed matter physics option for third years at Merton. Given the proximity of this topic to my own research, this has been a hugely rewarding experience.

I spent the summer after my first year at the Max Planck Institute for Complex Systems in Dresden, as a visiting student of this year's Martin Gutzwiller Fellow (my supervisor, Professor Siddharth Parameswaran). This was a great opportunity to both further my research and make many new connections. Indeed, the project on non-Euclidean dynamics is a collaboration which started here!

Additionally, I've taken the opportunity to take a course in Mandarin at the language centre, and have played on Merton's frisbee team, which have both been fun ways to take a break from the taxing world of physics! Having my fees and living expenses covered has freed me up to focus on my studies and to ensure some balance through involvement in College and Oxford life.

Black Academic Futures Graduate Scholar 2024-2025

I am pursuing the Bachelor of Civil Law (BCL) degree. After earning my undergraduate law degree from the University of Exeter, I wanted to deepen my understanding of public law and explore new fields such as competition law. The Black Academic Futures Scholarship covers my course fees and living costs, allowing me to commit myself to my studies.

I was drawn to Merton because of its academic reputation and its strong focus on law. I find it inspiring to be part of Merton's community. The atmosphere in the MCR is very convivial and I value being surrounded by like-minded individuals who share a sense of purpose and academic ambition.

My long-term goal is to become a barrister specialising in public law, a field I am interested in due to my strengths, values and personal background. Coming from a family of nurses, I have been inspired by my parents' commitment to serving society; it has instilled in me a similar drive to give back through my work.

Before coming to Merton, during my undergraduate studies I actively sought out opportunities to gain experience in public law. I volunteered at a law centre and Advocate, the Bar's national pro bono charity. These experiences put me in a strong position to complete a paid internship at the law reform charity Justice after I graduated. These formative roles have not only enhanced my skills and understanding of the legal profession but also provided me with mentors who continue to offer invaluable guidance.

When I applied to Merton, I knew that I would need to secure funding if I received an offer. Receiving an offer for the BCL felt great; moreover, when I learned that I had been awarded the Black Academic Futures Scholarship, I was thrilled that I could come to Merton to pursue the BCL and continue striving towards my professional goals.


