

what is the JCR?



JCR or Junior Common Room is quite a confusing term because it refers to two things at Oxford: the undergraduate body at a college and the specific common room that the undergraduates have access to. The JCR (undergraduate body) functions like a college student union and organises and funds lots of events, societies and sports teams like Quiz Society, BOPs and Welfare Week. We also manage the facilities like the TV Room and Games Room and sort things like storage boxes for the vacations. We also hosts fortnightly meetings (OGMs) to discuss college matters and how we can improve *your* experience.

OGMs are really important as it's where all our JCR decisions like the Budget for societies and reps gets discussed, it is also where really important and topical debates and motions get debated. There are free snacks, drinks and pizza at OGMs, which are currently held fortnightly on Sundays (1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th) at 8.45pm in the JCR - see you there!

Getting involved

There are so many different ways for people to get involved in college life and with the JCR.

- Attend OGMs and submit motions
- Join the JCR Committee (see roles HERE)
- Join any standing or sub-committees
- Talk to your reps about any concerns
- Attend societies or events





what is the JCR (legally)?

The JCR is governed by both the standing orders and the constitution. As the JCR is a charity, it must comply with these charitable aims:

The objects of JCR are the advancement of the education of Undergraduates for the public benefit, in particular by:

- 1) representing and advancing the interests of Undergraduates to the relevant authorities, both in and outside the college;
- 2) maintaining and improving the college life of Undergraduates and their relationship with with the wider college community; and
- 3) furthering all purposes which are charitable in law and incidental or conducive to the main objects

For more info about how the JCR is organised legally, check out the <u>Standing Orders</u> (day-to-day operations) and the <u>Constitution</u> (basics and aims of the JCR)- both available on the <u>JCR website</u>.

The Trustees of the JCR are the Members of the Executive Committee

General

The Executive Committee (click <u>HERE</u> for more info) are responsible for maintaining the JCR Constitution and Standing Orders, which are published on the <u>JCR</u> website.

The Vice-President maintains a register of Members, including email addresses. You have the right to opt out of being a Member of the JCR by writing to the Vice-President at any point in the year and can also change your mind.

Committees

The committees of the JCR are:

- Executive Committee
- JCR Committee (people with normal JCR roles e.g. Charities Rep, LGBTQ+ rep, BAME rep etc.)
- Standing Committees
- Sub-committees
- Permanent Sub-committees of the Exec e.g. Welfare Committee, Access Committee







How do committees run?



The Chair and the Secretary

THE CHAIR: Every committee needs a Chair (or two co-chairs) and they're responsible for organising meetings and for co-ordinating the committee's aims. All committees, except the Exec shouldn't meet outside of term time unless at least two-thirds of the Committee members agree otherwise.

THE SECRETARY: Every committee should have a secretary, who will record the business, minutes and maintain a file on the work of the Committee. This should be promptly published to Ordinary Members of the JCR, with the exception of confidential info and published within 5 days to the Exec.

They should NOT be the same person as the Chair.
The Chair and the Secretary should work together to compile the Agenda but anyone can contribute.

• If the Chair or Secretary isn't determined by the Standing Orders or Founding Resolution, then committee members should elect a one among themselves and the same applies if either are absent.







How do committees run?



Sub-Committees

Sub-Committees are made up of volunteering Members of the JCR and they are set up and responsible to members of the Exec to support their work. They are only established for up to a year.


Permanent Sub-Committees (of the Exec)

These Sub-Committees are also made up of volunteering Members but are permanently established and meet to discuss relevant issues with their designated Exec reps. We have Welfare and Equality and Access Sub-Committees - check with the reps about when this happens!

Standing Committees

Standing Committees are set up and responsible to the General Meeting (OGMs) for a specific goal or project e.g. creating the Games Room and JCR Kitchen and TV Room Improvements. They are also mandated to complete all work within one year and made up of Members of the JCR.


The Executive Committee

WHAT IS THE EXEC?

The Executive Committee, or the Exec, is responsible for the day-to-day administration of the JCR, supervises the JCR Committee and provides welfare, entertainment, facilities etc. for the JCR. Each member of the Exec is the 'designated officer' for a JCR Committee Member so they basically just act as a contact to the Exec and help them if they need. All Executive Committee Roles are elected in Trinity Term (Friday W3 for President and Friday W4 for other roles).

THE PRESIDENT

They're responsible for the general operation for the JCR and coordinate with college and the JCR. Responsibilities include:

- Chairing the Exec Committee, JCR Committee and OGMS
- Representing the JCR at meetings with College including the Governing Body and Development Meetings (there's A LOT at Merton) and at the Student Union (such as in the newly formed Conferences of Common Rooms)
- Advancing JCR Interests to College and communicating College's policies with the JCR, as well as to the wider university
- Organising and co-ordinating Freshers' Week with the Exec
- Negotiating with College over Battels (rent and bills!) with the Treasurer

 They act as the designated officer for the Affiliated Organisations and Careers Rep.




to should you ever have any questions or concerns. I also, on a less serious note, organize events throughout term on my own or with Arjun, the LGBTQ+ rep!



Here, everyone, starting with the President and the JCR Committee, is given the opportunities to tell their 'business' or ask questions (basically just means their news or whatever they want to tell the rest of the JCR e.g. when their events are or if they've done anything super cool).

Hustings of roles

This is where JCR Committee roles get husted (people ask questions to the candidates) and elected. More on that later!

First reading of motions

The motions get read out and then people discuss any opposition or support for it, before it gets voted on (or passes without any opposition)

How to submit a motion

- 1) Go to the JCR website and find the <u>'SUBMIT A MOTION'</u> form and helpful guidance on writing and submitting a motion.
- 2) Fill in this form and submit it by 6pm 4 days before the OGM. The vice president will send an email reminding you of this deadline!

Remember!

- You (the 'proposer') and your 'seconded' must be available to attend the OGM in question.
- If you have any questions or concerns, please message the JCR VP who will be more than happy to advise you on the creation of your motion.

You will need to lay out the key points of your motion like what the motion is aiming to achieve and the current circumstances you would like to change. At the OGM, you will be asked to briefly summarise your motion for everyone to hear and then may be asked a few questions on your motion.

If no-one has any opposition to your motion, then the motion will pass without needing a vote. However, if anyone opposes the motion then it will need to be voted on.

AN EXAMPLE MOTION:

This JCR Notes:

- 1. In only having knives, forks and spoons available, people are not given the opportunity to eat East Asian food in the way that it is most commonly eaten.
- 2. For people who are able to use chopsticks, having them as an option is more practical with respect to almost all East Asian dishes.
- 3. For people who are not able to use chopsticks, having them as an option provides an accessible learning environment for people to better engage with the cultures of the foods from which they're eating.
- 4. Good chopsticks and chopstick rests are hygienic, inexpensive, and appropriate to formal settings.

This JCR Believes:

- 1. That having chopsticks available is not only more culturally authentic but also more practical.
- 2. The JCR has a commitment to properly representing other cultures.

This JCR Resolves:

1. To mandate the Ethnic Minority Students' rep to open a dialogue with the hall to have a supply of chopsticks.

Elections and Hustings



<u>Hustings</u> is basically where all the candidates for a role are asked questions about why they are suitable for or might want the role. After this members of the JCR will vote for the candidate they believe would be best suited for the role.


There are three different election and husting processes used by the Merton JCR: for the Exec, for the General Committee and the Ball

Committee.

EXEC

One of my election challenges last year was to carry round a lettuce!

The process for electing the Exec happens in Trinity of each year, where each candidate publishes a manifesto of their plans for the role and why they believe they should be elected. They then have hustings, where they will have to give a short speech about themselves,



GENERAL COMMITTEE

The process for electing each General Committee Roles typically happens on an annual basis, with the exception of the Returning Officer, Welfare Helpers and Events Photographer, which are elected termly (check <u>schedule</u>). Unlike with the Exec Committee, each role is both husted and elected at the same OGM.

BALL COMMITTEE

The Ball Exec Committee is elected in a similar way to the JCR Exec Committee, requiring a manifesto, hustings and public secret ballot election. However, it also requires a public panel interview with members of the previous Ball Exec and the JCR/MCR Presidents. The rest of the Ball Committee will be appointed by the Ball Exec, Senior Treasurer, Domestic Bursar and MCR and JCR Presidents.

Complaints



The procedure for complaints in the JCR is as follows.

- 1. There may have been attempts at an informal resolution with the JCR President (or other Trustees if the complaint is concerned with them)
- 2. Any complaint of harassment will be dealt with the College's Harassment Policy
- 3. Any complaint of electoral malpractice will be dealt with using the procedure outlines in S. O. 10.7
- 4. Any other complaint will be dealt with using S.O. 10.6
- 5. Confidentiality is required throughout the complaint process


Unless there is good reason otherwise, complaints should be emailed to the Vice-President (Complaint Trustee) at <u>jcr.vp@merton.ox.ac.uk</u> and include the words "Formal Complaint" in the Subject. We aim to resolve complaints within 10 working days during term time, and 20 working days outside of term time.

After consulting with the Exec Committee, a complaint panel will be established of between 1-3 people to investigate the complaint. This panel will then present their findings and recommendations by email to the Complaint Trustee, Complaint Trustee, Executive Committee (by the Chair) and any person who is the subject of the complaint.

If this decision is appealed, it will be raised to college.
